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Learning Update

Year 3

In topic lessons, Year 3 have been studying Ancient Greece. They have looked at how Athens and Sparta were very different places to live in Ancient Greek times, if you were to ask them where they would rather live, I am sure they could tell you and give reasons why. They have also been looking at pottery. They have studied pictures of Greek pots - looking at how different shaped pots were used for different things and have drawn pots before making and designing their own.











In maths, year 3 have started their shape topic. To start this topic, they have been looking at angles. They have learnt about right angles, obtuse angles and acute angles - these ones are really tiny and cute. In the classroom, they have been making and spotting different angles - they even found some on the ceiling!







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Year 3 have been learning the skills needed for Handball. They started by making sure their passes were accurate, and were not allowed to move their feet. Then, they challenged themselves by making the circle of 4 larger and by using a smaller ball. They then tried intercepting the ball and marking their opponent, while others perfected their accuracy.







Year 3 winners of the cooking competition - 'We are chefs' were Madison Clarke, Rebecca Poole and Olivia Johnson, who created some mouth-watering delicacies.

Year 4

In Year 4 we are enjoying our topic 'Weather and Climate'. We have so far found out about the different climates around the world and, this week, we have learned about the part that the Water Cycle plays in our weather systems. Some of us chose to draw and label our own diagram of the Water Cycle. We are very proud of our work.










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As part of our topic on 'Sound', we made a 'sound sandwich' using lolly sticks, elastic bands and a straw. We learned that a range of sounds could be produced by blowing the sound sandwich to make the elastic band vibrate. The tighter the band, the higher the pitch of the sound. We had the best fun and could be heard 'making music' all through the school!



Our art topic this term is 'Sculpture' and so far we have enjoyed looking at the work of famous abstract sculptors such as Sir Anthony Caro and David Annesley.

Over the next few weeks we are going to create our own abstract sculptures but, to begin with, we have experimented by creating different shapes using paper art techniques. Can you work out how we created these effects? We are very proud of our work.















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
