#### Polite Notices

We operate a one-way system on site at the beginning / end of the



school day as it eases congestion on the pathways and at the school gates. Therefore please enter via the pedestrain entrance top gates, proceed down the hill, drop children off at their designated doors and then exit via the KS2 playground/gates through the bottom carpark gate.

A reminder that children should not be playing on any of the outdoor equipment (Frogtopia, Tadpole Towers, Climbing Wall, Outside Gym) at the beginning or end of the school day.



Dogs are not permitted on site so please do not bring them onto the school grounds.

You support and co-operation is much appreciated with this and we ask you to ensure that all adults who drop/collect children on your behalf as also are aware of the above. Thank you.

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#### Are you eligible?

All children from Reception to Year 2 are entitled to Universal Infant Free School Meals regardless of the parents' income. Parents with children in Reception to Year 2 classes who are in receipt of benefits, your child might be eligible to pupil premium, which is funding given to schools to raise achievement levels. Therefore, please sign up through the free school meals link below to see if you fulfil the criteria.

Children who moved to KS2 in September are no longer eligible for Universal Infant Free School Meals. Therefore, from Y3-Y6, parents have to pay (£11.50 per week / £2.30 per day) for children to have a school dinner, unless they are eligible for free school meals. Could you please ensure your ParentPay account is in credit prior to lunches being taken.

We are really looking forward to getting stuck in to this topic and we have already started drawing some Roman soldiers for our classroom display. Alongside this we will also be learning about the country of Italy in our Geography lessons. We are going to be very busy this term



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#### Year 5

Year 5 have settled back into school life brilliantly, they have been working hard in all areas of the curriculum and Mrs Wharton and Mrs Speed are very proud of them



#### Year 6



Year 6 have settled brilliantly into their new classroom and have made an excellent start to the year.

In Mathematics, we have started on place value and comparing, ordering and solving problems with numbers up to ten million. In English, we are reading the graphic novel of The Hobbit, and exploring the range of sentence structures that J.R.R Tolkein used in his novel. In science, we have learnt about how the heart functions, the main parts of the heart and the

human circulatory system. Finally, we have started our World War One topic. Before learning about trench warfare and the key battles that occurred during the war, we are learning the reasons as to why war started beginning with the World Power Alliances, The Balkan Crisis and the assassination of The Archduke Franz Ferdinand.

We are pleased to confirm that our Open Evening for admission to Year 7 in 2023 will take place on Wednesday 28th September 5.30pm - 7.30pm.


We are also opening the school to visitors from 5.30pm -7.30pm. Visitors will be able to walk around key areas of the school site, meet departments and talk to current students and staff.
