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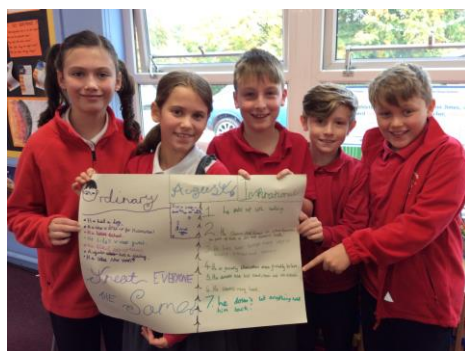

## Learning Update

### Year 5:

We are still really enjoying our class text **Wonder**. We've completed lots of interesting work based on the text including some collaborative work about whether August, the main character, is inspirational or ordinary. Our children showed how well they've engaged with the text by taking part in an animated discussion about it!



We've now moved onto using figurative language like simile and metaphor along with stylistic devices like rhetorical questions in order to write poetry based on the story.

We've been working hard with our **Power Maths** and successfully completed units in *Place Value* along with *Addition and Subtraction*. Those key skills are now helping us tackle our new unit - *Graphs and Tables*. Regular arithmetic homework is also keeping our skills sharp in a variety of other Maths areas.

Our Art topic this term is inspired by Islamic Art which links to our History topic. So far we have explored different forms of Islamic Art with the intention of finally designing and creating our own printing tile in this style. In DT we are currently designing a side dish for a Mexican meal, we are really looking forward to making these next week.

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## Year 6:

Year 6 made a fantastic start to the year in Autumn One and have had an equally great start to Autumn Two. They have approached all learning with a great attitude, resilience and perseverance.

In English, we have been exploring persuasive writing. Our skill building lessons have concentrated on the use of modal verbs in persuasive writing and the impact that active and passive voice can have on the reader we are trying to persuade. In mathematics, we are coming towards the end of our place value and four operations. We have built on our personal toolkits by looking at a variety of strategies and procedures for all four operations; long addition, subtraction, multiplication and division and we have now found strategies and tools that suit us to solve these types of calculations.



PE has seen us practicing our invasion game skills in basketball. We need to know the variety of passes we can use, how to effectively defend and dribble. We have also been working advancing our swimming skills every Friday, improving on the different strokes and water survival.

In history, we have been learning about The Western Front, trench warfare and will soon be learning about the key battles that took place along The Western Front. In geography, we have been looking at where South America is located in relation to the wider world & the climates and biomes of different regions across South America.

Year 6 have been fortunate to have our local PCSO, Andrea Horsnall delivering the Staffordshire Police Junior Cadet sessions in school. The first two sessions have focused on our community, the law and how we can communicate to one another and how the police communicate to each other.
