
Message from Mrs Ballinger

Reception

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
Year 1



Greysbrooke have been supporting some great causes over the past few weeks and Year 1 really came together for 'Anti Bullying Week'. We spoke about how our kind words really can make a difference. Each child was given a name of one of their classmates that they were to write an anonymous message to using their kind words. The care and support that they all showed for one another was so special to see, and the smiles on all of their faces helped them understand just how powerful our kind words can be!

Remember, remember, the fifth of November!

Year 1 have really enjoyed becoming historians and learning all about The Gunpowder Plot. Developing their understanding of chronology, they began by exploring the concepts of past, present and future. They were then able to apply this knowledge to their learning on Guy Fawkes; exploring who he was, the events that took place, why they took place and what became as result of this build-up of events. 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Year 2

Building on their knowledge of Shenstone, Year 2 have broadened their horizons, travelled slightly further afield and and have been leaning all about the history of Lichfield.

We have found out what has been in Lichfield for over 1600 years and what has been more recently built. Did you know there used to be a cattle market where Tesco now stands, people used to drink the water from Stowe Pool and Beacon Park used to be farmland?

We have found out about some of the different buildings in Lichfield and some of the not so pleasant things about Tudor buildings!

We have also been finding out about one of Lichfield's most famous residents-Samuel Johnson. We have been using printing materials from the Samuel Johnson museum to create their own dictionary.

If you want to find out more about the history of Lichfield, why not download the Lichfield Time Travellers App, where you can open time portals and meet people from Lichfield's history while collecting rewards for your Time Traveller's Backpack.

We had great fun this week at the end of our DT topic. After having tasted dips and dippers, we made our own guacamole dip. We spent the morning chopping and mashing, squeezing and mix until we had guacamole. We tasted this in school with our favourite dippers, it went down very well!









Our science topic has been looking at humans and animals. We have been looking at the differences between young and old, sorting animals and finding out how to look after ourselves. We designed a healthy meal using the Eatwell plate and carried out an investigation about germs. We used glitter to represent the germs, looked at how easily they spread and the best way to remove the germs.

As well as this, we have written some fantastic descriptions about Pudsey Bear, taken part in the whole school art project, practiced our sketching skills, worn odd socks, learnt lots of new shape words in maths, created dreams and wishes for Mrs Coxon's baby, found out about the continents, added to our phonics knowledge and have been getting ready for the Christmas performance.
