


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Learning Update

Year 3

In English, Year 3 have been learning about Rainforests and producing some fantastic non-chronological reports to showcase their knowledge. Following on from this, the children have used their reports to create a piece of persuasive writing to convince the Prime Minister to help stop deforestation.



In Maths, the children have been working really hard on their new unit: Multiplication and Division. They have been using concrete resources (such as counters) and pictorial methods by drawing circles and dots to support their calculations.



We have now finished our DT unit and had lots of success making our apple crumbles. The children were able to use skills taught in peeling, chopping and mixing. The evaluation sheets that were completed at home show that they tasted great too!

In Computing, the children have been learning how to create their own stop motion animations using iMotion on the iPads. This process began with the children creating small flipbooks and eventually they were able to create their own storyboard and characters for their animation.





We have started a new topic in Science learning all about Rocks. This includes where they come from and how they are created, and later in the topic we will be learning about fossils! So far the children have learnt about the layers of the ground and investigated some of the material properties of rocks.



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Year 4

Year 4 have continued to demonstrate resilience in their learning, kindness to their peers, gratitude when assisted by adults and they aspire in each lesson to achieve their very best.

Since our last update we have been incredibly busy developing our addition and subtraction knowledge in Power Maths;, we have used manipulatives to develop a greater understanding of exchanging amounts and have developed our skills in using bar models and part whole models.



In English we have been writing non-chronological reports linked to Black History Month and narratives based on the Roman Empire. We are currently working on a discussion text based on Roman inventors.

In Geography, we have been discussing the features of the Mediterranean and what makes it so special and we have shown a good understanding of the different regions within Italy. We are now going to evaluate life in Bologna. We have had some lovely PE lessons; learning Roman dances, developing our hockey skills and we even had an Archery lesson between rain showers.

We had the most wonderful day in mid-November, baking bread in our Design and Technology topic. Miss Callahan must have been mad letting us all mix and knead our dough at the same time. Despite flour everywhere, we had 100% success and all dough rose when proving and had a good texture when baked. Parents helped us evaluate and we had comments which Paul Hollywood would have been proud of - 'Handshake worthy' and 'looked just like the baps I buy in Sainsbury's.' Well done to all the children for their patience during this day.

Our observational drawing skills have developed in our Art sessions based on Italian architecture, we are really pleased with the outcomes of these drawings and use of pastels.



Our children continue to consider others; acting as learning coaches in lessons, selling cakes and sweets to raise money for charity, discussing and celebrating their differences and by showing care and understanding to friends who have injured themselves or are a little under the weather. Year 4 are such a caring class.
