### Polite notices

**Driveway** - for health and safety reasons, children and parents are not to enter / exit school site via the school driveway. ### Weather Watch!

We would like to remind parents of procedures in the event of heavy snowfall, which could lead to a school closure:

The decision to close school is only taken following much consideration about the health and safety of pupils and staff. The ability of Catering staff to travel to school to provide the children with lunch is another necessary consideration, as well as the advice received from Pupil Transport Services about the accessibility of outlying county roads and the safe transport to and from school of the pupils residing there.

Decisions are usually made early in the morning, as circumstances can obviously improve or deteriorate overnight and I am sure that you can appreciate that many children and staff travel from varying locations to school.

Following any significant incident of snow, the decision to close the school will be posted on **Staffordshire County Council's website**. Additionally, we will post a message on our **school website**, **twitter account**, and will notify parents by our **parent text** facility.

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# Learning Update

### Reception:

We have been learning about Healthy Eating, we read 'Oliver's Vegetables' and filled the sand tray with different vegetables, we loved exploring how they smelt and felt. We made these delicious fruit kebabs! We used grapes, oranges, bananas, strawberries, raspberries. We really enjoyed tasting them.





We have just started our Plants and Growing Topic; we have explored what happens when you put white flowers in water with food colouring. We loved seeing them change colour.







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### Year 1



Musicians, artists and sports stars!

Year One have settled so well into the Spring term and have really thrown themselves in to all of their learning:

In art, the class have begun to explore primary colours through painting, understanding what primary colours are and how we can use these to create secondary colours. They will then begin to put this knowledge into practice when creating some amazing pieces.

In PE, this half term is all things golf. So far, they have been practicing their putting and chipping skills and we definitely have some pros in the making!

The class have had great fun when practicing this terms song 'In the Groove' on glockenspiels, exploring the song and learning to appreciate many different forms of music.

We have put huge emphasis on Reading for Pleasure recently and the class are loving all the books that we have been immersing ourselves into. The class 'reading tree' is really starting to fill up now with some great book reviews given by the whole class.





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### Year 2

Year 2 have got off to a great start in 2023 showing kindness, resilience and aspiration. We have started lots of new topics and are enjoying these.

In maths, we have been looking at money, recognising and sorting coins and notes and using a numberline to calculate amounts. We are finding out that there is more than one way to make different amounts.

In DT we are going to be spending this term making a moving vehicle. We have already started to look at what makes a vehicle move and have found the axel, chassis and cab on vehicles in school. Check back later on this term to see how our vehicles are coming along and if we have been able to make our vehicle move.

We are really excited about our Great Fire of London topic. In history we have started to find out about life London in 1666 and how it differs from today. In PE we have created a dance to retell the story of The Great Fire of London, moving in time to the music and thinking about position and direction. We have been busy practicing our class assembly and can't wait to see the year 2 parents in school to come and watch.




