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# Learning Update

#### Reception

In Reception Class we have been planting trees, we went to Lamas Land in the rain, but it didn't dampen out spirits. We have been learning about patterns and we used the large 2D shapes to make these patterns outside.



We have loved our Superheroes Topic, we made Superhero Shirley's out of plates. We also learned about real Superheroes like Doctors, Vets and people who help us.







We have been learning about Pirates, we enjoyed drawing our own pictures and making our own pirate characters from paper plates.







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#### Year 1

Thank you again for all of your help and support with Year 1s class assembly! They really loved being able to showcase all of their learning and dedication to their performance to all who came.



Science in summer term has kick started with the unit of 'plants'. We're so fortunate to have such amazing green spaces here at Greysbrooke and we have definitely been taking full advantage of that, going on nature walks around the school grounds to see what different types of plants we could spot and sketch. We began the unit discussing how plants grow, what they need to stay healthy and tracked this through growing cress, which the children were very proud of. Moving on to understanding the functions of different parts of a plant, we dissected and labelled flowers to gain a further understanding of plants work.

What makes a good friend? In PSHE, we have been talking all about 'relationships', focussing on family and friends and how these can look and mean different things to different people.

The children presented their ideas of 'what makes a good friend' to the class and also came up with their own team greetings.

It was lovely to see the whole class come together to talk about just how important these strong bonds and relationships can be.





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#### Year 2

Year 2 have been very busy with lots of new topics. Their learning this term is taking them to Africa, where they will use skills in DT to create an African pouch, learn about Kenya in geography and in history all about Nelson Mandela.

They have started their history topic by putting key events of Nelson Mandela's life into chronological order and have started investigating in DT materials and pouches so they can create their own. Did you know that colours have different meanings? Yellow represents wealth as well as beauty whilst blue represents love and harmony.





















Year 2 also have a new science topic and will be looking at habitats. The first question they were asked in this topic was 'Is it alive, dead or never been alive?' Some things were easy to identify, others like paper were a little more tricky. They did a great job of investigating outside and finding things in the school grounds to answer the question. They were not afraid to pick up a bug or two! They have been lucky with the weather at the start of the topic, hopefully this will carry on as they start to investigate habitats that we have in the school grounds.



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Children have also been learning about measuring and undertaking practical lessons to find out how long, tall and wide things are. They have measured in centimetres and metres. They investigated if a bus would fit into the classroom-it wouldn't! It was suggested by a member of the class that they should measure the school field, all of the children accepted the challenge and off they went armed with metre sticks and some sunshine.

#### **HAPPY BIRTHDAY TO THE HOME GUARD**

On 14<sup>th</sup> May 1940 the Government appealed for able bodied men aged 17 to 65 to enlist in the Local Defence Volunteers to defend the British Isles against the imminent threat of German invasion.

One quarter of a million men volunteered in the first 24 hours. Men from all walks of life – some retired, some in reserved occupations such as engineering, construction and coal mining, many had served in the Great War 1914 -1918. It was not unusual to be working 40 - 60 - 80 hours each week and then volunteer additionally for the Home Guard as the LDV was later renamed.

Throughout the duration of active service from 14<sup>th</sup> May 1940 to 31<sup>st</sup> December 1944 men killed in action or deceased from wounds totalled 1206, more than 6000 men were wounded and 1033 men were awarded decorations and honours.

On Sunday  $14^{th}$  May 2023 Staffordshire Regiment Museum is hosting a Discovery Day to celebrate the  $83^{rd}$  Anniversary of the formation of the Home Guard.

Enthusiastic groups, re-enactors and volunteers are already planning their contribution for the day. Home Front folk are encouraged to join in whether ARP, Land Army, WVS, Police, Fire Service. All are welcome to help celebrate this special day.

We specifically want to encourage local people who had relatives in the Home Guard to come along on 14<sup>th</sup> May with photos, stories and memorabilia of their family member's wartime history to share with Museum staff, volunteers and all our visitors.

The Anniversary Day pays tribute to the 1.7 Million Home Guard volunteers.
