



Covid-19 Remote Learning Information for children and parents/carers

If you are having to self-isolate at home, this is what you can expect from school:

- ✓ Lessons and resources will be provided for each day which will closely match what you would have been doing in school. The lessons and resources will be a mixture of worksheets, powerpoints and clips/links to recorded lessons (e.g. Oak National Academy website, Ruth Miskin, BBC Bitesize).
- ✓ Lessons will be made available to you through Google Classrooms or email.
- ✓ If you don't have access to the right technology at home, don't worry. Please let school know and we will deliver/send out to you a pack of work that needs to be completed during the duration that you're self-isolating.
- ✓ Your teachers will look closely at the lessons that you are missing. They will identify lesson links and resources, so that you don't miss out.
- ✓ You will get a call during the time that you are off. We care about how you're feeling and will make sure that we can help in anyway if needed.
- ✓ We would recommend that you read a book independently or with your parents during your self-isolation period. Reading helps to expand your vocabulary and access your work better in school.
- ✓ On return to school, your teacher will be keen to discuss your learning and ensure that you have understood the work completed before moving on.
- ✓ Don't forget you always have online access to Times Tables Rock Stars, Numbots, Education City, Accelerated Reader (Y2 upwards). There is also access to Literacy Shed, Pobble 365 & BBC Bitesize that you don't need a login for.

If the class bubble has to close and you have to work from home, you will continue to follow the lessons on your school timetable.

- ✓ The lessons set and resources provided will be from a mixture of online videos (through Oak National, Ruth Miskin, BBC Bitesize), along with worksheets, filmed clips/lessons and web links provided by your class teacher.
- ✓ These lessons will be made available on Google Classroom by midday on the first day and from 9am on subsequent days. If you don't have access to the right technology at home, don't worry. Please let school know and we will deliver/send a pack of work to you.
- ✓ While learning at home, there will be times when pupils may be asked to complete online quizzes or upload some of their learning. It is expected that this is carried out as per teacher instruction. From this, your teacher will be able to evaluate how well you've understood the work and, if needed, reteach topics that pupils are finding difficult.
- ✓ We would recommend that you read a book independently or with your parents during the period of school closure. Reading helps to expand your vocabulary and access your work better in school.
- ✓ Don't forget you always have online access to Times Tables Rock Stars, Numbots, Education City, Accelerated Reader (Y2 upwards). There is also access to Literacy Shed, Pobble 365 & BBC Bitesize that you don't need a login for.
- ✓ Please don't worry during the period at home. Your teachers will work hard to ensure that you keep on top of your work. You will receive a call from a member of staff to find out how you are.
- ✓ In the event of your class teacher being ill and unable to provide learning, another member of staff will upload learning on Google Classroom as soon as possible on that day.

What school expects from you:

- ✓ Complete each lesson on paper or online as directed by your teacher. For most lessons you will need a pen or pencil and a ruler; make sure that you have these ready!
- ✓ Complete each lesson as best as you can, if you are finding it challenging, let your teacher know using the agreed communication channels as stated by your teacher
- ✓ Bring in completed learning on your return to school so that your teacher can see if you've understood
