Message from Mrs Ballinger

I would like to start by thanking you all for your continued support during our recent Ofsted inspection. The 2 days the inspectors were on site were jam packed and I would like to acknowledge and thank all the staff and children who were amazing throughout. We look forward to sharing the final report with you once it has been published.

The weather has certainly turned cooler and more inclement, and so I want to remind you of what happens in the event of heavy snowfall, which could lead to a school closure. The decision to close school is only taken following great consideration about the health and safety of pupils and staff. In addition, the conditions of the site and the ability of Catering staff to travel to school to provide the children with lunch are other necessary considerations, as well as the

advice received from Pupil Transport Services about the accessibility of outlying county roads and the safe transport to and from school of the pupils residing there. Decisions are usually made early in the morning, as circumstances can obviously improve or deteriorate overnight, and I am sure that you can appreciate that many children and staff travel from varying locations to school. Following any significant incident of snow, the decision to close the school will be posted on Staffordshire County Council's website. Additionally, we will post a message on our school website and will notify parents by our parent text facility. We aim to achieve this by 7.45am, subject to there being no technical difficulties, and

remain the priority at all times.

On Thursday 30th November, we were delighted to welcome 'Matt the Tale Teller' into school to carry out some story telling sessions with the children and parents. The children were treated to a series of interesting tales told in a unique and entertaining way. They were captivated! You won't want to miss it!







LEARNING UPDATE

Year 5

Year 5 have recently been looking at a range of forces, in Science. We spent a lesson looking at friction and how it is a force between two surfaces, and what can impact the level of friction - i.e. a slippery surface, which would therefore create less friction. We spent a lesson using Newton Meters, testing out the friction between a constant surface and a range of individuals shoes, within our groups.



Our Year 5 DT Mexican Feast unit came to an exciting close a couple of weeks ago when we used all our knowledge from research about typical ingredients used in Mexican cooking to design and make our own side dish. The classroom was full of gorgeous smells like coriander and lime as we made guacamole, colourful salads and salsa to name a few. Our skills in safely using a knife to chop, a fork to juice a lime and a spoon to remove the stone of an avocado certainly came in handy. We had a wonderful time eating our dishes along with a vegetarian chilli and tacos - the tasting and evaluation was a wonderful end to all our hard work!



In Science this term we have been learning about Light. In the first lesson, we used our iPads to evidence our findings from different enquiry questions. We explored how light travels, why shadows are formed and how shadows changed. In the second lesson, we focused on how we see. Check out this beautifully drawn and labelled diagram of an eye.

Our class text this term has been the incredible War Horse by Michael Morpurgo. It tells the story of World War 1 through the eyes of a young horse called Joey. We have absolutely loved reading the book, it is a real roller-coaster of emotions with many cliff-hangers. We read the final two

chapters in one session whilst drinking hot chocolate. The best way to finish an incredible book!






Our English lessons this term have been based around writing newspaper reports. We've looked at a variety of different example texts and learnt about the structure and text features which are specific to newspaper reports. For our final piece, we wrote about the events of chapter 16, where Joey is found in no-man's-land and a German soldier and English soldier flip a coin to see who keeps him. Dear Parent/Guardian

Vision Screening/Eye Tests <u>ARE NOT</u> provided within schools in Staffordshire.

We strongly recommend that all children have regular eye tests at an Optician once a year.

NHS Eye tests for all children are free at any Opticians.

It is important that even children with apparently normal vision should be tested. As children can often compensate very well for some eye problems which need to be identified and treated early to avoid lifelong visual loss.

The Eye test checks that your child's vision is developing normally. It is performed at this age so that any reduced vision or difference in vision between each eye can be picked up before the visual system is fully developed and any treatment can be started.

You do not need to do anything, if your child:

Is **currently** under the care of an Eye Specialist (Ophthalmologist / Orthoptist / Optometrist) at a Hospital Eye Clinic.

Or

Is **currently** under the care of a local Optometrist (Optician) or had a recent sight test.

If none of the above applies, please arrange with your local Opticians for your child to have a free NHS Eye Test.

We support messaging from UK mobile numbers only (which does not include messages sent from landlines, international mobile numbers and some 'number masking' mobile apps). To prevent the health visitor from sending messages to you, text STOP to our number. Messages are charged at your usual rates.
